

Call for Papers. Abstracts due by March 15.

The 2026 NYSAA conference will be held in Rochester, NY, April 17-19. Anyone interested in presenting a paper or poster session pertaining to the archaeology of New York and adjoining regions is welcome to submit a paper as well as a themed session. Because of the rich abolitionist history of Rochester, one session will be offered on African American archaeology in New York. Other suggested themes include papers on the Revolutionary War (250th anniversary), the Haudenosaunee, and other Native American research in New York, Historical Archaeology Research, Community Engagement and Outreach, and the Archaeology of Cemeteries. Presentations should be 20 minutes in length. Easels will be provided for posters, which can be any size up to 48" x 60".

One of the presenters of either a paper or a poster must be a member of the NYSAA. To join a chapter near you, visit nysarchaeology.org/nysaa/join-nysaa/. If you do not live near a chapter, you may join as an At-Large member (Individual = \$20, Student = \$10). Individuals are limited to one paper or poster, although individuals may co-author multiple papers.

Abstracts for papers or posters must be received by March 15.
